Impact on LCAP Yuba River Charter School is highly involved in engaging our stakeholders. Input from Faculty, Staff, Parents, Students and outside community members is crucial to providing a healthy and inclusive school environment. We provide a variety of opportunities for stakeholders to be involved in the school at various levels, from governance and decision making to volunteering in the classrooms and attending our seasonal festivals. Providing ample opportunities for our community to get involved is a key aspect of YRCS. Impact on LCAP Stakeholder input has provided YRCS with several identified areas of focus to promote student success: academic rigor, student academic achievement, assessment, effective preparation for high school, communication and life skills. Across all stakeholder groups, support to encourage positive behavior and social health was determined as a priority to help promote student success, as well as positive community involvement.

As YRCS is a school of choice, parents attend an orientation during the application process to decide if the school is a good match for their child's educational needs. This orientation involves meeting members of the Faculty, Staff, Board, Parent Council and Students, an opportunity to ask questions of any of those individuals, as well as a school tour in which participants walk through each classroom during the school day. YRCS serves all students regardless of race, ethnicity, disability or economic status. The school enrolls students by lottery and maintains an active waiting list.

Our school governance model also demonstrates our commitment to involving stakeholders. Parents, community members and faculty serve on the Board of Directors and have many open channels for communicating with school leadership. YRCS also has an active Parent Council, in which parents are involved in planning all school events and festivals, as well as class fundraising. The Faculty Council meets weekly to make decisions on curriculum and programing. The Student Council meets monthly, making recommendations on relevant issues to the Faculty Council and the Board of Directors.

Throughout the year, a variety of events are offered to engage our community at many levels. Community Forums, in which any member of the community is encouraged to attend, provides a venue to openly discuss specific topics in a low pressure, round-table discussion format. An annual parent survey, as well as an annual faculty, staff survey is distributed and made available for community members to give input on various aspects of the school. The School Director offers open office hours for "non-confidential" public meetings once a week, as well as times for more private concerns. The school community is regularly invited to attend Board Meetings through the all school messaging system. We also offer monthly Community Education events in which community members have an opportunity to attend a lecture or activity based event focusing on specific elements of child development, Waldorf Education or school governance.

Beyond this, we offer a mandatory Back to School Registration Day in which all necessary information for the year is distributed to families, along with a Spring Open House and several all school concerts and presentations.

Our community is encouraged and inspired to get involved in many aspects of life at Yuba River Charter School.

The following student priorities were described by stakeholders, based on community forums and community surveys, and have been incorporated into our plan:

- Academic rigor: bringing a challenging curriculum for grades 1 8 as it relates to Waldorf Curriculum and Common Core Standards
- Student academic achievement: increased scores on standardized assessments school-wide
- Regular assessement and student accountability: universal, formative and local assessments taking place regularly throughout the school year, checking progress of student learning as related to Waldorf Curriculum and Common Core Standards
- Common Core / Waldorf Curriculum alignment: through teacher education on Common Core Standards, along with parent education on understanding Common Core Standards and Waldorf Curriculum through the grades.
- Effective preparation for high school: a clear understanding by the teachers as to what will be expected of students in High School, in academic, as well as technological skills
- Communication and life skills: ethical and conscious use of computers and technological tools, including keyboarding, digital media formats, and digital presentation tools, as well as the ability to speak clearly and effectively to a group both large and small
- Encourage positive behavior / social health: working to eliminate bullying incidents and having a clear plan for reporting such issues
- Create peaceful school environment: while working to eliminate bullying incidents, creating the environment and culture of peace, respect and conscious interactions
- Effective parent concern process: respond to every parent concern in a timely manner

The LCAP draft was submitted to the YRCS board of Directors on May 4, 2016. The LCAP draft was submitted to the Parent Council on May 11, 2016. There were no comments or questions requiring a written response from the Director.

The public hearing to present the LCAP was held on May 11, 2016. LCAP was approved by the YRCS Board of Directors on June 1, 2016 and posted on the school website on June 2, 2016.

Based on LCAP goals, actions and services were principally directed toward unduplicated students - English Language Learners, Redesignated Fluent English Proficient Students, Foster Youth and Low Income Pupils - but all students benefit from the resources provided. By providing a credentialed Curriculum Specialist, as well as credentialed RTI staff, all students, including unduplicated students benefit from early academic intervention work as well as regular additional academic support throughout the year.

 - (1) The number of cohort members who earned a regular high school diploma [or earned an adult education high school diploma or passed the California High School Proficiency Exam] by the end of year 4 in the cohort where "cohort" is defined as the number of first-time grade 9 pupils in year 1 (starting cohort) plus pupils who transfer in, minus pupils who transfer out, emigrate, or die during school years 1, 2, 3, and 4.
 - (2) The total number of cohort members.
 - (3) Divide (1) by (2).

- (e) "Suspension rate" shall be calculated as follows:
 - (1) The unduplicated count of pupils involved in one or more incidents for which the pupil was suspended during the academic year (July 1 June 30).
 - (2) The unduplicated count of pupils with a primary, secondary, or short-term enrollment during the academic year (July 1 June 30).
 - (3) Divide (1) by (2).
- (f) "Expulsion rate" shall be calculated as follows:
 - (1) The unduplicated count of pupils involved in one or more incidents for which the pupil was expelled during the academic year (July 1 June 30).
 - (2) The unduplicated count of pupils with a primary, secondary, or short-term enrollment during the academic year (July 1 June 30).
 - (3) Divide (1) by (2).
