Teena Corker serves as the Associate Superintendent for Educational Services at the Nevada County Superintendent of Schools. She was hired in July of 2018. Following, she went to the Penn Valley Union Elementary School District and served as a K-8 Principal at three schools for eight years and also served as Co-Superintendent for six months in the same school district.
